Operating Procedures

To inquire if the line has operators - one click

To break or interrupt, send **Error**, space, msg.

Error should be sent rapidly; repeat **current** word

If asked to repeat, repeat from **last full** word

If so needed, repeat entire message back once recv'd

Send "**U**" to inquire the operator's sine

Send "**R**" to indicate you are ready to receive

Send "**P**" if you need current word repeated

Send "**F**" to ask for faster code, "**S**" for slower code

Send "Shave& a haircut" to sign off & close station

Opening the Line

Once it has been determined operators are on the line, send a "**U**" to determine sines. When receiving a sine, respond in-kind with your sine. Send your sine prior to end of message. Keep all telegraph messages sent or received. If msg is repeated, respond with "**K**" if message was sent back without error; if error, re-send msg.
